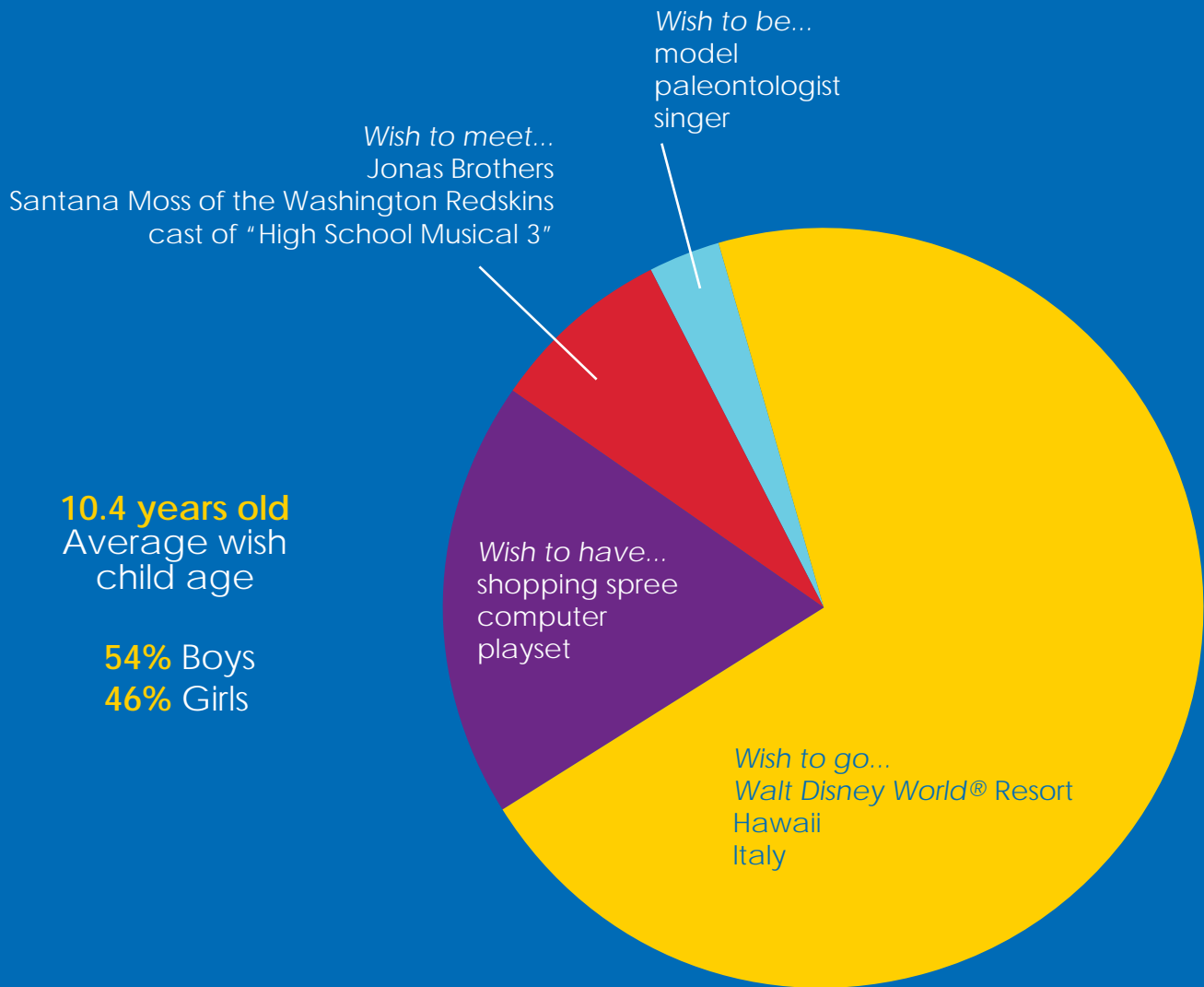

WILLIAM, 9

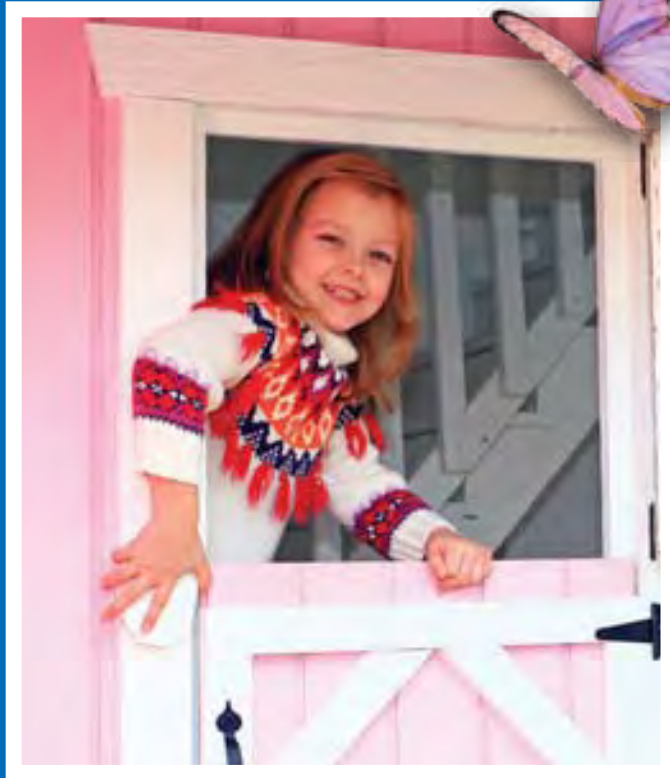
